

# INTRODUCTION

We find ourselves at the 35th edition of the Galway Film Fleadh! We are celebrating 35 years of bringing **New Irish Cinema, World Cinema** and filmmakers from across the world to Galway for the annual Fleadh. And we open the Fleadh with a very special pilgrimage to Lourdes for the ladies from Ballygar who are hoping for their own miracles in *The Miracle Club*. We take a road trip in *Apocalypse Clown*, an existential journey in *The Martini* Shot and face a tense stand-off on a farm in *Lie Of The Land*. A young woman finds herself in a struggle with family in period drama *Lies We Tell* and two women bond on the streets of Dublin in *Verdigris*. We have 34 Irish films in the programme, with 20 World Premieres and seven Irish Premieres.

We have new sections in the festival this year with **Defender** bringing us stories of courage and resilience from around the world, **Artist On Film** celebrating the work of artists across the artforms and **Architecture On Film**, exploring our landscape and buildings.

Our **Music** section brings the best of documentary and drama with the inimitable John Murry on the screen and live in concert, *The Skids: Revolution* features the 1980s' band that have entered a revival, a focus on the electronic music and hip-hop scene in Ó Bhéal alongside icons of the music world on screen and in conversation with Joan Baez and Cyndi Lauper.

Award-winning World Cinema features stories of romance in differing circumstances with the complexity of love in *Mutt*, unexpected love in *Here*, enduring love in *Love Without Walls*, and love through the decades in *Past Lives*. Our **Peripheral Visions** competition returns with the best in emerging talent with stories about land, family secrets and a post-apocalyptic animation while our **Country of Focus is NOWHERE**, that void in the middle where people are left without a place to call home.

Filmmakers are the life blood of the festival and this year we remember two good friends of the festival who are no longer with us. A retrospective screening of *Kings* will remember Tommy Collins and to honour James Flynn's contribution and legacy to the Irish film industry, we are delighted to name the **Best First Short Drama** award in his name.

We have 95 feature films from 43 countries with 21 World Premieres, six European Premieres and 60 Irish Premieres, we will screen 102 short films, and moderate panels, events and masterclasses. Bain taitneamh as an Fleadh. What will you watch?
