





Welcome to the 11th Galway Film Fleadh. Again this year we are endeavouring to bring you a wide variety of new Irish features, documentaries and short films and the very best of cinema from around the world.

We are extremely proud to present a Special Tribute to one of Ireland's most versatile actors, Gabriel Byrne. As part of this Tribute there is public interview, Actor's Masterclass and we are showing six of his films. His contribution to the Film Industry in Ireland has been enormous. Long may it continue.

There is a strong selection of new Irish features including Agnes Browne, I Could Read The Sky. The White Pony. Park, The Book that Wrote Itself, and the Irish animation feature Carnivale. An underlying theme in this year's programme is the number of Irish film-makers working outside the country: Martin Duffy with The Bumble Bee Flies Anyway. Eoin Moore with Break Even, Ronan Carr and Brian Tucker with Exiled and Damien O' Donnell with East is East. New Irish acting talent is also beginning to emerge. It's relatively new but already it has made a considerable impact. It must be remembered though that shooting on digital in itself is irrelevant if the basics aren't in place. The beauty of shooting on digital is that it is cheap and flexible and allows the film-maker scope to concentrate on the story and the performances.

Lastly. my sincere and warmest thanks to the Festival Manager Fiona Kilkelly and the entire Fleadh team who have made the 1999 Fleadh such a pleasure to be a part of and last but not least a thanks to all the film-makers who are participating in this year's programme.

Already a wife and mother, Agnes Browne suddenly finds herself coming of age. She resolves to take a second chance at life and love, while always keeping her twin senses of humour and resilience.

The year is 1967. Living in a boisterous and teeming central Dublin neighbourhood, the Brownes have always gotten by. But with the unexpected death of her husband. Agnes and her seven children find their finances wanting. In order to pay for her husband's funeral Agnes borrows money from a loan shark Mr Billy. To make ends meet Agnes sells fruit and vegetables at her Market stall helped by her best friend Marion. When a French baker, Pierre takes an interest in her, Agnes realises that she still has her own life to live. As she copes with the normal family crisis she finds humour in the most difficult of circumstances and still holds out for her dream of seeing Tom Jones live in concert.

Direct from the Director's Fortnight section in Cannes, *Agnes Browne* is adapted from Brendan O Caroll's best selling novel 'The Mammy' and is Anjelica Huston's follow-up as director to her chilling debut feature *Bastard Out of Carolina* which screened in the Galway Film Fleadh in 1996.

The real heart of the movie is in the camaraderie between Agnes and the other women stallholders, particularly the excellent Marion O Dwyer in her first movie.



Liam Ó Mocháin's debut feature *The Book that Wrote Itself* is an ultra low-budget feature which is full of energy and no small amount of charm. Riddled with hilarious caricature the relentless sending up of the creative process is always its central theme.

Vincent Macken thinks he has written the best post-modern novel ever. 'The Daughte Conn' is a Celtic quest saga set in Ireland 200 years ago. It tells the story of Deisin, all of the Fianna who has fallen in love with Fionnula, the Princess of Connaught. Her fall sets out five great trials that Deisin must perform in order to win his daughter's hand marriage. Each task of this quest takes the form of a riddle in a poem.

After trying to sell his novel at a book fair Vincent accidentally hears two literary agent ridiculing his book. After a brief confrontation Vincent sets out to prove that his story timeless and could be set even in the present day.

Vincent hires Aisling, a student film-maker, to document his quest on camera. Using manuscript as their guide they set out to re-enact the story of Deisin. This means a whirlwind tour of Ireland but during the journey Aisling seems more intent on making documentary on him rather than documenting his novel. The struggle begins. Soon. Vincent feeling trapped by the confines of the written word wants to adapt his unwritt novel and make an Oscar winning movie.

Uzuki, a shy young Japanese girl from Hokkaido in Japan's far north arrives in Tokyo in the fall when the peach blossom is falling to enroll at University. A new city and new apartment. Though she is withdrawn and a little awkward meeting new people, she is befriended by an outgoing fellow student Saeko with whom she joins a fly-fishing club. When Uzuki is unexpectedly embarrassed by an innocent question asked by a fellow student 'Why did you chose this university?', we know there are secret motivations for her move to Tokyo. These reasons are beautifully revealed as she wanders around Tokyo on her bike. Her enchanting days are filled with little discoveries and adventures.

Shunji Iwai's latest, April Story is almost a perfect miniature of mood and feelings, the cinematic equivalent of a Haiku poem. It is sweet without being saccharine, uncynical without being naive; as a portrait of a young person's untrammelled emotions, it recalls '60s European cinema in its freshness and innocence. - Derek Elley. Chuck Workman's documentary of the Beat generation is more than just a portrait of the beatniks as a bunch of ageing men. On the contrary, the coming together of Jack Kerouac, Allen Ginsberg and William S. Burroghs in New York in the forties and the literary movement on which they were to have an enormous influence, forms the starting point for a history of American counter culture spanning fifty years. Workman traces the development of various bohemian cliques of poets, painters and jazz musicians during the fifties as well as the hippie and political students of the sixties and early seventies. The Source examines the influence their ideas have had on the gay and feminist movements and to what extent they still affect the art world, political movements and pop culture today.

Workman's film was three years in the making. The documentary includes hitherto unpublished interviews with the great underground heroes such as Burroghs, Timothy Leary and Allen Ginsberg. It also includes archive footage of Jack Kerouac and Neal Cassady. Extracts from the novels of Kerouac, Ginsberg and Burroghs are performed by John Turturro, Johnny Depp and Dennis Hopper.

rotha mór an tsaoil [the hard road to klondike]



Rotha Mór an tSaoil is truly creative documentary based on the autobiography of Irish Migrant labourer, Mici MacGowan (1865-1948). MacGowan's book, published under the title 'Hard Road to Klondike', is a stirring account of his life as a migrant worker and his exile in America at the turn of the century. It gave a direct account in everyday Irish of the post-famine experience of displacement and migration. Mici's story mirrors the lives of millions of European emigrants who crossed the Atlantic in search of a new start and illuminates the trauma of this way of life.

But Rotha Mór an tSaoil is a historical documentary with a difference. Using MacGowan's text, Bell weaves intricate layers of archive material to illustrate the story. Using several old silent feature films and early documentary footage he constructs a collage of unrelated film material which , though not directly related to MacGowan or the places he visited, creates a strong visual sense of his life and travels. McGowan's story is fascinating, especially as he recounts his encounters with the Native American Indians. He is sensitive of their plight but he is also one of those early migrants who indirectly contributed to their hardship.

Rotha Mór an tSaoil is one of the most important documentary films ever made and transmitted in this island. Drawing on a variety of story telling techniques and modes, the lessons which we can derive from it in future story telling are manifold.

Us Boys is the story of Ernie and Stewart Morrow, two bachelor brothers who live thirty miles from Belfast. Born and raised on the family farm in the Glens of Aintrim they live a simple rural life and rarely travel outside of their Glen. Their farm and home show little signs of the twentieth Century. They have little regard for the "electric" not to mention television or washing machines. Living on a diet of fresh air, hard work, potatoes, cigarettes and tea, their lives have continued unchanged for seventy years. But 75 year old Stewart's health is deteriorating and Ernie who is 78 must bear the burden of most of the work. Gradually Ernie becomes more dependent on his neighbours and relations and soon change is unavoidable.

Filmed over a four year period, this marvellous documentary portrays a Northern Ireland we rarely get to see on screen. Though they have counterparts in many parts of Ireland their Scots-Irish dialect seems strangely exotic. It reinforces the island of Ireland as an island with many traditions and ways of life. It's new but also familiar. *Us Boys* is creative documentary-making at its best. Always fascinating, compassionate and respectful — it is also an important piece of work.

Universally acclaimed film-maker (*Breaking The Waves*) and motivating force behind the Dogme 95 initiative. Von Trier stirred up a whirlwind of controversy with his own Dogme project, not least because of his determination to push cinematic taboos with an explicit sex scene (one passed uncut in the UK in a landmark decision there by the British Board of Film Certification). This is only an element of Von Trier's - and *The Idiots*, and indeed Dogme's greater aim; to confront and startle audiences, to shatter taboos and challenge conventional notions of cinema.

Denmark

Turning 180 degrees from his earlier, excessively stylised works such as the astonishing *Europa* ('91). Von Trier appears to revel in the freedom afforded to him by compact digital technology, and throws himself into the exercise with great aplomb. Semi-scripted, seemingly largely improvised, he presents us, in quasi-documentary fashion, with an anarchic serio-comedy about a group of middle-class drop-outs who pretend to be mentally retarded in public places; an extended experiment in regression - 'finding your inner idiot', as one of the bunch puts it - aimed at challenging the niceties of 'civilised' society. Karen(Jorgensen), an aloof, fragile stranger hooks up with the bunch after a chance encounter in a restaurant - and an initial, episodically amusing scenario gives way to conflict, disillusionment and hidden tragedy. Eccentric, fascinating and ultimately touching, this furthers the case for Von Trier as the significant European director of this generation.



Ronnie, a bartender approaching middle age, has drifted for most of his life, afraid to marry, have a family, or build a career. One day an opportunity to finally turn everything around appears: a popular Manhattan tavern is for sale. Unable to find enough money to buy the bar he convinces his best friend Dave to become his partner. Dave's sceptical wife Carol who dreams of moving out of their cramped quarters in Queens to a house in Long Island, relents only after Dave agrees to keep his day job at a mega-store.

Ronnie raises the rest of the money from his sister-in-law Gina, providing he gives Tommy, her wayward 14 year old a job. The rest of the money comes from Jerry, Ronnie's boss, and mentor. Unwittingly Ronnie begins to fill Tommy's need for a father and his own need to be one. The opening night is huge success but as quickly as the business builds it falls apart. Their battle to keep their business is a true test of their friendship and perseverance.

The Tavern is Walter Foote's debut feature. His direction is always assured and he expands what seems like a small story into a comment on fundamental themes of love, friendship, family and loyalty. Foote has created authentic characters battling with the American dream. The music of the Sawdoctors is used throughout proving that their songs are as relevant in the States as the West of Ireland. They also make a cameo performance — busking in the subway and later graduating to playing a proper gig in a bar.





Kresten is awoken in the early hours of his wedding night with the news of his father's death. Leaving his bride in bed and his circle of upwardly mobile friends in Copenhagen he arrives at his father's ruined farm in the depths of the country. Kresten has always denied having a family and is deeply embarrassed about his humble rural background. Now he must sort out not only his father's funeral but also what is to become of Rud, his mentally disabled brother. The farm is dilapidated and Rud is in need of constant care and attention. Reluctant to neglect his new responsibilities and in an effort to stall his new bride he calls her on the phone and begins to tell her a string of lies.

Gradually, he begins to forge a close bond with Rud and the farm but he comes up with a plan which will enable him to return to Copenhagen and his conformable lifestyle. He puts an ad in the paper for a housekeeper — but when Liva arrives on his doorstep all of his good intentions are turned upside down. Liva is not the woman she pretended to be and is in fact escaping a shady past. Soon, one unexpected guest after another shows up at the farm; amidst the chaos Rud starts to come out of his shell and Kresten must decide what he really wants from life.

One of the big hits at this year's Berlin Film Festival Kragh-Jacobsen's *Mifune* is the third film to be shot under the Dogme 95 set of rules. Though it shares some of the concerns of Vinterberg's *Festen* and von Trier's *The Idiots*, Kragh-Jacobsen's film is a romantic-comedy which expertly unfolds its feel-good ambitions.





The quiet existence of a dysfunctional family in a rural French village is disturbed when Sonia, the eldest daughter returns with her husband and young child. Her arrival seems to set every member of the family on edge.

While *More Than Yesterday* follows a number of characters it focuses mainly on the two sisters. Sonia's sister Francoise is a young teenager who feels trapped in her family and small village life. She is in love with her selfish cousin Bernard, while Sonia has never recovered from a relationship with the man who wrestled control of the local factory away from her alcoholic father. A festival in the local village is the catalyst for events which have momentous consequences for all the family. Behind situations of apparent calm the background to the family is slowly revealed and old family wounds are reopened.

The director ably sidesteps the stridency of melodrama with an approach that seems deceptively to have no particular style, but is made up of measured shifts in tone, subtle camera movements and shots held for daringly long stretches at a time, all heightening the material's ability to inch under the viewer's skin. When the homeless Hanna finds 100 German marks, she and her friend Victor want to blow it all and spend the night in a hotel but their search for a room escalates into a chaotic journey through the city. Jochen, a farmer, journeys to the city to find some nostrings female companionship. When he meets a heroin addicted street prostitute, he develops impossible romantic fantasies that are destined to come to nothing. Peschekle is a burnt-out business man waiting to pick up a colleague at the airport. There, he loses his wallet and accuses Feliz, an Angolan boy of stealing it. To make amends he offers to drive the stranded boy to his relative's home.

Blended with all this are a group of delinquent kids intent on causing trouble, disgruntled Berlin taxi drivers and Ricardo who has gone to the airport to pick up Feliz but who has been delayed after a traffic accident.

Nightshapes is a hard-edged comedy full to the brim of stories that interweave and overlap. Characters cross each other's paths only fleetingly as each of them make their journey though the night streets of Berlin.

The Danish film-maker Lars von Trier is one of the most controversial and exciting film-makers to emerge in recent years. He is universally renowned for his films such as *Europa, Breaking the Waves* and his latest film *The Idiots.* In the past, Von Trier's eccentric methods were always a talking point. His reluctance of travel (he often directed scenes miles from the location) and his attitude to his actors were always the signs of a legend in the making. In 1995, with the Danish director Thomas Vinterberg they drew up a set of 10 rules which became known as Dogme '95. Von Trier's first Dogme '95 film was *The Idiots*.

In the Spring of 1997, Jesper Jargil was requested by Von Trier to make screen tests of individual actors, in preparation of the making of *The Idiots*. Jargil agreed, on condition that he could be present for the entire shoot and make his own documentary.

The Humiliated is a fascinating account of Von Trier's working methods. During the period of the shoot Von Trier keeps an aural diary where he recounts his doubts and fears, his dilemmas and his recurring obsessions. We witness Von Trier as he opens up to his actors but always retaining a safe distance. He is sensitive, strict and sarcastic. At one point he claims to be genuinely happy, which of course in turn makes him even more anxious. The Humiliated is consistently amusing and intelligent and is a must for anyone interested in the film-making process.







Jadzia Pzoniak (Olin), the mother, is a cleaning woman. Bolek (Gabriel Byrne), the father, works nights as a baker. Jadzia says she married her husband for a good reason - but just at the moment she can't remember what it was.

Once weekly, she sneaks off for a liaison with her boss. Roman (Rade Serbedzija). Bolek and Jadzia's daughter Hala (Danes), is sneaking out nights, too, to see a young cop named Russell (Trese, from *Palookaville*). When the seemingly virginal Hala reveals otherwise to her family, the entire Pzoniak family march on Russell's house for a singularly explosive confrontation. Brash, bold and larger than life, *Polish Wedding* plays like a heady, European comedic melodrama transplanted to the suburbs of Middle America; the movie's mixture of sex, religion and family craziness infused with enormous energy by the leads. Olin gives her frustrated housewife great life and conviction, Byrne is suitably enigmatic and Danes again radiates next-big-thing potential. An anecdotal, off-the-wall paean to generational values, this is a warm, funny, unexpected charmer.

Exiled is the debut feature by Bill Muir. co-written by and co-starring Ronan Carr. Shot in a vibrant and immediate style on location by Wellington Lee, and featuring a cast of up and coming Irish talent, the film is a significant addition to the growing sub-genre of films set in the young Irish immigrant communities of New York.

The film tells the story of Brendan McDonagh (Paul Ronan), a young Dubliner who emigrates to New York in the summer of 1991. On the run from Ireland for armed robbery, he moves with his northern cousin Sean (Ronan Carr) into Sunnyside, Queens, which the latter describes as 'the 33rd county' (owing to the large Irish immigrant population). Brendan's early enthusiasm for starting a new life is soon tempered by the discovery that Sean and his friends have connections with the IRA, shipping arms to republican paramilitaries in Northern Ireland. The centre of their activities is the local bar, Blooms, where the Blarney-talking Irish American owner Devlin is persuaded to give Brendan a job and help secure a Green Card.

Although supportive of the ideals of the republican movement, Brendan refuses Sean's request to help move a consignment of guns due for delivery later in the week. Unlike Devlin, who has raised the funds to purchase the shipment. Brendan's vision of Ireland is grounded in the realities of modern life – "There's no mist rollin' down the hills in the housing estate I live in". Sean accepts his cousin's reservations but asks that he assist him as a personal favour. Brendan relents, accepting Sean's promise that this will be a once-off 'job'. The relationship between the two men forms the thematic core of the film: the tension between principle and personal loyalty – a tension which reflects both individual and national questions of identity.

However, the authorities have neglected to tell her that these battalions were dissolved long before and that nobody will be sent to fetch her from this beautiful but desolate location.

Xiu's trainer, Lao Yin, is a simple and solitary Tibetan herdsman. He shares his army tent with Xiu Xiu and despite his concern for her well-being she is completely indifferent to him. Xiu Xiu learns from a travelling peddler that the cavalry unit has been disbanded, and that without a wealthy family or influential friends it is unlikely she will ever acquire her travel permits. She yearns to get back home to her family and she begins to give herself to passing soldiers and officials in a desperate effort to get back to the city. Soon her name is tarnished. Lao Yin looks on helplessly as she persists in this self-destructive course. Despite her indifference he attempts to help her and searches for a way to get her home.



Saigon is where the paths of four people cross; four people, who for very different reasons, find themselves strangers in their own land. A new era has begun in Vietnam's history — the western lifestyle is encroaching on traditional structures at an increasing rate and the enchanting atmosphere of Old Saigon is slowly being swallowed up by bright lights and neon signs.

Young Kien An works as a lotus picker. Her boss is a teacher and poet Dao who lives a life of seclusion due to an illness which has left him disfigured. None of Kien An's fellow workers have ever seen their boss but when Kien An sings a song which Dao remembers from his youth, he is inspired to begin writing again. Hai is a rickshaw driver who becomes smitten with a young prostitute and after rescuing her from two sleazy customers he begins to linger outside the hotels she visits. Woody a young street-seller with a tyrannical father meets an ageing GI named James Hager who has come back to Vietnam to find his daughter. Their relationship becomes one of misunderstanding and suspicion as James begins to lose himself in the past.

Northern Ireland comedian, Jimeoin McKeown, has been enjoying cult status since he moved to Australia in the early 80s. *The Craic*, which was written by and stars McKeown was the second biggest opener ever in Australia when it opened there earlier this year. McKeown stays true to his comedic background, without resorting to one-liners. *The Craic* is packed with larger than life characters - Irish and Aussie eccentrics within the classic road movie genre.

It opens in Belfast in 1988 as Fergus and his best buddy Wesley are involved in a violent confrontation with Colin, an IRA psycho just before he gets arrested. Seven months later they've jumped country and have landed in Sydney where they live in a cockroach infested house and are always on the lookout for immigration officers.

When Fergus participates on a TV dating show he is chosen by a dim-witted beautician and they win a holiday in Queensland. When he's away, the immigration authorities arrive at his house as Wesley makes his getaway out the back. Wesley catches up with Fergus just as Colin arrives on the Gold Coast under a witness protection scheme.

In retrospect, and considering that its status as a modern classic has been consolidated so rapidly (along with Oscars for Supporting Actor Spacey and Christopher McQuarrie's unforgettable script) it's difficult to remember what an unknown proposition *The Usual Suspects* remained until its unveiling at 1995's Sundance Film Festival. An unknown director, an eclectic cast, a seemingly indecipherable plot... indeed, it's all these things, along with one of the most memorable iconic movie posters in recent times, that contribute to 'Suspect's unique triumph.

One of the many joys of Singer and McQuarrie's Pandora's Box is that constant ability to be knocked for six at any moment, to finally think you've got everything sussed and... realise how far wrong you were. There are surely some audience members out there yet to experience its delights (beautifully shot in widescreen, it's an essential cinema movie), so let's simply say that this is one of the great crime movies of recent times. A tale of five crooks seemingly brought together at random in a police line-up who find out all is not as it seems. While Spacey and Del Toro have the showy turns, Byrne's Dean Keaton is the movie's heart and conscience (and for many its greatest enigma), a con-man trying to escape the lure of the underworld, unwittingly dragged into that one last job. It's a great performance in an unforgettable film.



Braveheart scribe Wallace scored a big hit with his directorial debut, assisted undoubtedly by lead DiCaprio's post-Titanic megastardom: this oft-retold swashbuckler only truly comes to life, however, when the ageing Musketeers take centre stage, given full fruity flavour by an inspired mix of old pros. There's memorable turns from Depardieu as self-pitying braggart Porthos, Irons as solemn, devout Aramis, Malkovich as a strangely touching, emotional Athos and Byrne, outstanding as the valiant, still passionate D'Artagnan - all of whom look like they're enjoying themselves enormously, stealing any scenes that aren't nailed to the floor.

For Byrne, it's the perfect mix between his higher-profile Hollywood jobs and less-likely arthouse gigs - here, he takes a stock, two-dimensional character and gives him unexpected depths, with a particularly touching final scene. The expected Hollywood liberties to Dumas' late sequel to his Three Musketeers are taken (DiCaprio is youthful Despot Louis XIV and his wronged twin Philippe, it's up to the retired 'all for one, one for all'-ers to right the various wrongs) resulting in an agreeable, crowd-pleasing romp.





After its hugely successful screening at the Sundance Film Festival, *Genghis Blues* has become one of the most talked about documentaries of 1999. Subsequent screenings at the Berlin Film Festival had audiences scrambling for seats.

Paul Pena played blues with the greats, T-Bone Walker, B.B King and Bonnie Raitt. In 1995, the blind bluesman became the first American ever to compete in an unusual contest of multi-harmoic "throatsinging". The autonomous Republic of Tuva, wedged between Siberia and Mongolia, for centuries has been isolated from the rest of the world by jagged mountains and Soviet restrictions. Only recently has the Tuvan art form of throatsinging become known to outsiders. Pena discovered Tuvan throatsinging on a short-wave program of Radio Moscow fifteen years ago. Multiple voices emanated from a single vocalist and he was captivated. He practised for the next decade and incorporated throatsinging into his blues music. When a group of Tuvan throatsingers toured America. Pena went along and gave an impromptu performance of his own style of this ancient craft. As a result the Tuvans invited him to take part in their national throatsinging contest.

Genghis Blues follows Pena on his trip to Tuva to take part in the contest. Much of the beauty of this fascinating documentary revolves around the friendship between Pena and Kongar-ol Ondar, the throatsinging champion of Tuva.



Michael Winterbottom's ironically titled *Wonderland* is a wonderfully acted and emotionally rewarding slice of London life in which the versatile director enters Mike Leigh territory with considerable success.


Wonderland unfolds over four days in November, not the most beautiful time of year in London: the chilly, often rain-drenched streets of the city are the backdrop for an examination of a family in crisis. At the beginning of the film, the family connections aren't spelled out, but gradually the links become clear as three sisters and their parents struggle to come to terms with the cards life has dealt them.

Nadia works in a cafe and lives alone; she meets men via a dating agency, usually with disappointing results. Her older sister Debbie works as a hair dresser and is separated from her oafish, frequently drunken husband. Debbie seeks refuge from her loneliness in a series of fleeting sexual encounters. Molly the youngest sister, seems at first to be the happiest of the three. She's nine months pregnant and her partner, Eddie has a good job selling kitchens. But without telling Molly he quits his job. The sister's parents, Eileen and Bill have a very strained relationship. They desperately miss their son Darren who left the family home without telling them where he was going.

As handled by Winterbottom, the lives of these basically sad people are not as bleak as might be supposed. The film is suffused with stoic humour and ends on a note of guarded optimism. These people might find life daunting but they have the will and resilience to survive. The performances by the ensemble cast are just about flawless - David Stratton, Variety





Stephan Elliott's follow-up to *The Adventures of Priscila Queen of the Desert* is altogether a far more outrageous affair. From the craziest of beginnings, Woop Woop works itself up to the most delirious of frenzies. Angie's father, Daddy-O (Hollywood veteran Rod Taylor) rules the roost in this mad town — nobody gets in or our without his permission. The film relishes in the bad manners and bizarre behaviour of this town of inbreds. This is a film in which nothing is sacred: from Rogers and Hammerstein to a giant kangaroo — there are no taboos.

On one hand an engaging children's fantasy, on the other a touching examination of matters of identity, death, family and belonging, director Newell (who moved onto *Four Weddings And A Funeral* and *Donnie Brasco*) bringing a sensitive hand to this well-built tale.

Traveller king Papa Reilly (Byrne) has settled his two children Ossie and Tito (exceptional, unselfconscious debuts from Fitzgerald and Conroy) in Dublin, determined to give them a conventional home; the arrival of their grandfather (Kelly), magical tales and white horse-which they keep in their rather cramped flat – in tow, sparks off a trail of events that see the boys go on the run, and their father forced to face the events of his past... Thankfully neither cloying nor cute, Jim Sheridan's script successfully evokes a multifaceted, contemporary Ireland, showcasing traveller culture with a rare sensitivity and understanding. More than that, however, there's a beautiful mix of the magical and the brutally real, with a powerful tale of redemption (Papa's) at its core. Byrne has rarely been as effective onscreen, supported by an exceptional supporting cast (with small but memorable bits from Brendan Gleeson, Jim Norton and Anita Reeves). One of the more neglected high points of recent Irish cinema, it's bound to become a family perennial, and well worth another look.



Renzo Kinoshita -Retrospective

Renzo Kinoshita made his name internationally in 1997 with a satirical film about modern Japan entitled Japonese. Born in 1936 Renzo established Lotus animation Studio in 1967 where with his wife Sayoko he produced a prolific number of commercials and won many

His keen observations on the brutality of modern life were reflected in his short films as were his strong anti-war sentiments. This is particularly true with Pica Don 1978 again a collaboration with his wife which is an extremely moving and powerful film on the atomic attack on Hiroshima, still a very sensitive subject in Japan.

In 1985 he founded Asia's first International Animation Festival in Hiroshima, now the third most important animation event in the world. Renzo used the Hiroshima Festival as a platform to raise the profile of independent Japanese animation and to celebrate animation as an art form in its own right.

Renzo Kinoshita died in 1997 of Hepatic cancer.

Gabriel Byrne made his first major impact as a lead in David Drury's still pertinent political thriller, a Paralax View-esque yarn that stands head and shoulders above most '80's British cinema. As a flawed hack who inadvertently finds himself up to his neck in a political scandal, peeling away layers of deception to find increasingly nasty truths, he's a doomed everyman taking on the might of the Thatcherite machine. Considering some of the rather dodgy moves made by Blair's government on the Freedom Of Information front recently, one wonders if Drury's deep-rooted cynicism isn't just as — if not more so— necessary today.

Beyond that, this is a fine, well-oiled thriller, nicely cinematic and well played by a treasure throve of great British character actors - most notably the greatly-missed Elliot. Still underrated, still under-viewed, this is a rare chance to view what is unquestionably one of Byrne's finest screen moments to date.


The experimental feature from Irish film-maker Eoin Moore went down a storm at this year's Rotterdam film Festival and has already won several international awards. Break Even is an accomplished debut which mixes a raw grainy look with some beautifully observed naturalistic performances.

Alex is a part-time construction worker and a small-time criminal who has nothing to show for his 33 years but a broken marriage and a seemingly aimless life. When he meets a young Bosnian prostitute, Svetlana, he seems to get some purpose to his life. Svetlana faces deportation so she tries to coerce Alex to marry her. Feeling trapped by Svetlana, Alex gradually begins to spend more time with her friend and fellow prostitute Ruth. Just as his personal life begins to complicate he is caught stealing from the building site where he works.

Moore builds a tangible sense of these sad, emotionally bereft lives, creating moments of surprising spontaneity in his portrait of the outcast characters and the community of which they are a part. Visually, the film's freewheeling style is heavily influenced by Lars von Trier and Wong Kar-Wai.- David Rooney, Variety

Over the past three decades Donal McCann has given us plenty of reason to believe that he is the finest stage and screen actor to be found on these shores. In 1998, the Galway Film Fleadh programmed a special tribute to his screen work and Gerry Stembridge hosted a public interview before a hugely receptive audience. Bob Quinn and Tom Collins filmed this interview and it forms the backbone of *It Must Be Done Right*.

This excellent retrospective of the work of McCann (titled a "montage" rather than a documentary) includes clips from some of his greatest roles and includes interviews with John Turturro, Gabriel Byrne, Bernardo Bertolucci, Leila Doolan, Sebastian Barry, Tom Murphy and many more. But it is the interview, with McCann himself, which is the main strength of this film. In superb form, McCann spins yarns about his early efforts to break into acting. His precision timing and animated delivery transforms the interview into a veritable 'performance' captured on film. It Must Be Done Right is no less than a national treasure.





Sunburn begins in Dublin, as Davin, a reckless twenty-something tries to escape the responsibilities of home and begin a new life in the US. He travels to America with a bunch of Irish students who are on their way to Long Island. There he meets up with Robert who stumbles from a comical stint on a commercial fishing boat into an enviable job with Carolyn, an American woman in her late thirties facing divorce and a lonely summer. Robert's pure heart and simple nature are a comfort to her and their relationship blossoms into romance.

Aideen, a cheerful and outgoing girl, works long hours as the dispatcher for a taxi company and dutifully sends her earnings back to her family in Ireland. However, *Sunburn* hinges on Davin, who stumbles from one crisis to another. Though he may have good intentions at heart and be a likeable rogue, his lack of responsibility and indifference to the people around him stretches his friends patience. His hapless attempts at damage control are undermined by a growing crush on Aideen.

Sunburn is a wonderful debut feature with excellent photography and a script which is beautifully paced and above all authentic. Cillian Murphy as Davin. Barry Ward as Robert and Paloma Baeza as Carolyn all give subtle, measured performances.

I could Read the Sky is adapted from the photographic novel by Timothy O'Grady and Steve Pyke which was published to great acclaim in 1997. It's a film about memory, music, love, identity, loss and exile.

It tells the moving story of an old man living in a bedsit in London, remembering his life, growing up on the West coast of Ireland and his journey to London. The film unravels the strange twisting drama of a working man's life. It moves from a decaying rural past to a vividly modern present.

This film is not a conventional drama in any sense and because of its structure it is able to create a new way of portraying its major themes. It is the state of memory that this film evokes - not memory as re-enactment but as texture. It gets to the essence of how we remember. Memory as fragments, as small details and layers, moments of precise clarity and hazy recollections. The babble of voices at a Station party, the family united before departure and the vibrant colours of remembered youth.

The film hinges on the extraordinary performance by acclaimed writer Dermot Healy. From the lines of living on his face to his awkward gait, Healy inhabits his character, a mixture of childlike innocence and jittery, agonised distress.

I Could Read the Sky includes cameos from Marie Doyle Kennedy, Stephen Rea, Pat McCabe, Brendan Coyle, Timothy O'Grady and Steve Pyke and has a wonderful soundtrack including Iarla O'Lionáird, Sinead O'Connor, Martin Hayes, Liam O'Maonlai and Noel Hill.

After Blood Simple and Raising Arizona, the Coen Brothers' third feature firmly established them as America's foremost ironic auteurs - a decade later it remains possibly their richest, most beautifully evocative and pleasingly enigmatic work to date.

Situated perfectly somewhere between tribute and pastiche, the Coen's riff on 1930's gangster pictures (with more than a tip of the hat to the writings of Dashill Hammett) also gave Gabriel Byrne his most iconic leading-man role to date, as right-hand man to Leo (an on-form Finney), a melancholy crimelord at war with rival Caspar (Polito) in an unnamed American city during the Prohibition days. With its litany of double-crossings, triplecrossings and double-triple crossings, it's best not to get too hung up on the plot or symbolism contained therein - just revel in the innumerable delights; a rake of superb performances, masterful set-pieces - an assault on Finney's boudoir set to Frank Patterson's rendition of 'Danny Boy', Byrne's marching Turturro's slimy crook to his impending doom in a deserted forest, Carter Burwell's beautiful score and a leading man who seems to get beaten up by just about everyone...

And as for the meaning of the hat? Well, hey - maybe it's just a hat...

Arguably the US mainstream's first art movie since Days Of Heaven; and quite wonderful. Time Out Film Guide

Doug Liman takes a quantum leap on from his much-loved no-budget smash Swingers with this slicker, sharper, more expansive comedy/crime picture. That's not to say, however, that this idiosyncratic talent's blanded out - indeed, quite the opposite. The result? The most electric, hysterically hip high-octane American movie you'll see this year, and the first post-Tarantino flick that takes Quentin's ball and rolls with it. Superficially, there are similarities with Pulp Fiction. John August's extremely savvy script, aided immeasurably by Liman's inventive, kinetic direction leaves all comparative points eating its dust.

Simply put, a group of young people collide in Los Angeles' raucous underground scene on Christmas Eve; in the first instance, Ronna, a down-on-her-luck supermarket clerk, finds herself brokering her first drug deal to raise the cash to avoid eviction, with rather unfortunate results. In the second strand, Ronna's British co-worker Simon (the memorable Timothy Olyphant, who at one point affects the worst Irish accent in recent cinema) is having a night to remember in Vegas, until his seemingly magnetic ability to attract chaos lands them in very hot water, culminating in an important lesson about the physics of large, fast cars in narrow alleys.

Finally, we discover the back story of Adam and Zack, Ronna's eager would-be customers, most definitely not what they seem. The boys' own misfortunes see them in the clutches of a creepy cop (Fichtner - the new Christopher Walken) with, as yet unspecified plans for the increasingly anxious duo... Criss-crossing, replaying from different perspectives and tying up his disparate strands with effortless panache. Liman establishes himself as a serious contender with his major-studio debut. With a firm grasp of his milieu (and all-too-rare spot-on take on club culture) and infectious, non-judgmental enthusiasm for his vividly drawn characters, he brings together a superb, mostly unknown ensemble in sweet harmony with his buoyant tale. In short — you'll have a ball.

The May Lady is the latest film by the most prominent female film-maker in Iran, Rakshan Bani-Etemad. The protagonist is Frough, a 42 year old Iranian woman who directs documentaries. She is successful in her work but faces problems in her private life. She is divorced and thinking about starting a new relationship, but her teenage son Mani, regards himself as the man about the house. The result is a covert war of nerves between mother and son. In the meantime her latest commission is to make a documentary about 'the ideal mother'. She surrounds herself with video tapes on which women talk about the social problems they are confronted with, such as the painful consequences of the war with Iraq. The name of the protagonist refers to Frough Farrokhzad, the brave and talented poet who used her own life and poetry to encourage women to defend their own lives.

Rakshan Bani-Etemad has produced her most personal film in the haunting May Lady. While her method recalls the cooly distanced views of Godard, Akerman and Duras, it also emerges organically from her own background as a socially engaged documentarian.

Snake and Tolyasik are two schoolboy friends. Impatient with their modest lifestyles the two boys hatch a plan to become millionaires. They head off to Moscow to earn their fortune as buskers. Snake plays the accordion and Tolyasik sings old ballads, much to the delight of passerbys. With their pockets full of money they journey home but are mugged en route and return empty-handed. More desperate than ever, they decide to break into a department store. Here, they gorge themselves on food and drink and try on new clothes. However, when they leave they forget to bring their old clothes and are easily traced by the police. Their dream comes to an abrupt end and Tolyasik is seen to a reformatory for one year. Snake is let off because he is not yet 14 but he is heartbroken without his best friend.



Welcome to the world of the petty Dublin criminal. There's Massive, Mags, The Byrne Bros and then there's Cal, a small time crook who always has time to help the elderly even when he is robbing the local post office. Cal's number one fan is his young son David who's following in his father's footsteps, much to the annoyance of his mother. The principal of his school is looking for a reason to expel him, the guards are on his trail and a rival gang want his luminous trainers. When they all meet up in the principal's office, something has to give.

Making ends Meet is directed by Declan Recks who last year completed the much praised short film Quando.



When Gabriel Byrne first smouldered on to our screens in the classic Irish soap 'The Riordans' he instantly set tongues wagging and hearts a' flutter. In a few short weeks he went from relative obscurity to become Pat Barry, the scandalous 'other man' in Maggie's life. Soon after his first appearance, Byrne was coming out of a country pub where he was greeted by a crowd of cheering and applauding people on the street. Such was the impact of 'The Riordans'. Such was the impact of Gabriel Byrne. His follow up in 'Bracken' (a spin-off from 'The Riordans') assured Gabriel Byrne's place as a household name in Ireland.

Since these early days, he has become synonymous with Irish cinema and an international star in his own right. The first of the new wave of 'Hollywood Irish' stars no other home-produced actor has been sought by so many of the world's most accomplished and interesting directors including such luminaries as Wim Wenders, Constantin Costa Gavras, Tony Scott, Nike Newell, Billie August, Jim Jarmusch, The Coen Bros., Bryan Singer, Gillies MacKinnon, Michael Mann, John Boorman etc etc.

Byrne was a late starter by movie standards. After a brief spell teaching in Spain he returned to Ireland to take up another teaching post and was all of 29 before he first treaded the boards. After a short spell in amateur productions, he then joined the Focus Theatre and later the Project Theatre during its glory days of the 70s where, amongst many others, he worked with Jim Sheridan, Neil Jordan and Liam Neeson. After seeing him in 'The Liberty Suit'. John Boorman cast him in *Excalibur*. And the rest, as the fellah says, is history...

In 1981 he moved to London and joined 'The National Theatre' and began working on British features including Ken Russell's bizarre *Gothic* (as a memorable Lord Byron) and David Drury's *Defence of the Realm* where he gives a wonderful performance as a down-on-his-luck journalist. But it was *Miller's Crossing* that truly launched his international career. Byrne's performance as Tim Regan in the Coen Brother's masterpiece is one of the most memorable characters in recent cinema. The synergy of slick direction, evocative score, razor sharp costumes and design are underscored by an exemplary cast. Byrne relishes the sharp, fast, witty dialogue and his complex and enigmatic character and subtle comic touches are at the heart of the film.

At home in both esoteric, less mainstream work (*The Prince of Jutland, Siesta, Dead Man*), romantic turns (*The Assassin, Trigger Happy, Cool World*) a classic here and there (*The Usual Suspects*) and the odd blockbuster or two (*Enemy of the State, The Man in the Iron Mask*) his CV remains packed and eclectic.

His contribution to the Irish Film Industry has been immense, not least his involvement as a Board Member of The Irish Film Board. In the last few years alone we've seen him in *The Last of the High Kings,* the charming and grossly underrated *Frankie Starlight*. *This is the Sea,* and the Irish language *Draíocht*, which he wrote and starred in and which was directed by the late, much-missed Áine O'Connor. He also starred in and co-produced *Into The West* and was Executive Producer on *In Name of The Father* which received 7 Oscar nominations.

Constantly dabbling in many other fields to great effect, he set up a literary magazine 'The Bridge', has been a contributor to 'Magill' magazine and has written an acclaimed book, 'Pictures in My Head'. Above all however, he remains a consistently versatile and memorable presence, and one of the greatest stars this country's ever produced. Long may he remain so.



'Scorn Not His Simplicity'. 'On Raglan Road'. 'The Town I Loved So Well'. Three classic Irish songs that are synonymous with the passionate voice of Luke Kelly. Simply put, Luke Kelly was one of the finest singers Ireland has ever produced.

Luke is a fascinating account of his life and shows him as a charismatic and complex man, for whom music was a vocation that went hand in hand with a passionate political consciousness. It begins in the poor inner city flats of his origins, to his journey to England where he lived an itinerant life, moving from one job to another. It was here too that Kelly became politically aware and first decided to become a folk singer. His epiphany came in a Newcastle pub in 1960 when he heard 'The Old Triangle' being sung in harmony. His contact with England inspired and radically transformed Kelly's life.

Luke details his return to Ireland and his days with The Dubliners. In a time of huge social and political changes, Kelly became a voice for a generation as he sang against injustice and degradation. Including a myriad of interviews including Christy Moore, John Faulkner, Bono, Joan Bergin, Ronnie Drew, Phil Coulter, Gerry Adams John Hume, Mary Maher and many more, and priceless archive footage with Kellys red hair flaming Luke gives a comprehensive account of his life. But in the end it his interpretations of the songs which make this documentary so special.



Based on the novel by William Trevor, *Felicia's Journey* is an intriguing psychological drama centring on the relationship between a naive adolescent Irish girl and a psychopath who pretends to take her under his wing.

Joseph is a middle-aged catering manager who lives alone in a large house in Birmingham. He spends his evenings watching a video of an old TV cooking programme as he prepares his own elaborate meals. His daily routine is intercut with scenes of a young girl, Felicia on a ferry from Ireland, travelling to Birmingham in search of Johnny, with whom she's passionately in love.

Interweaving past and present, brief illuminating flashbacks reveal that her father has tried to prevent her from seeing Johnny and that Johnny's mother will not give his number or address to the young Felicia. What nobody else knows is that Felecia is pregnant. As Joseph's chilling past is slowly revealed, Felicia's trusting naiveté becomes more apparent and she is drawn ever closer to Joseph's twisted world.

Through the deftly constructed characters and emotionally resonant dialogue, Egoyan shows how two strikingly different individuals are forced to deal with various forms of denial and suppression...the beautiful Cassidy carries the film on her young shoulders in a flawless, highly modulated performance.
