

After a youth is tortured by the police, a riot explodes on the streets of Paris. Vinz, Said and Hubert find a gun lost by the police in the riots and threaten to kill a cop if their friend dies. Mathieu Kassovitz's sensational second feature as a director changed the cultural landscape of French cinema when it landed at the Cannes Film Festival in 1995, winning the Best Director prize. It went on to become one of the defining films of its generation and a stone-cold classic of Nineties cinema.

They eventually make a connection and thus begins her journey to find magic in the music and hopefully cure her dad.

NEW IRISH FILM SPILT MILK



Set against the backdrop of 1980s working-class, inner-city Dublin, Bobby and his pal Nell torment their family, friends, and neighbours as they set up their own private investigation enterprise. When Bobby's big brother Oisin disappears Bobby and Nell must embark on a quest to find him.
